◆ How to activate your new CCD student account...

- 1st. Log onto the CCD homepage (www.ccd.edu)
- 2nd. Under LINKS click on 
- 3rd. Click on CurrentStudents
- 4th. Put your S number and your 6 digit pin number
- 5th. You will see, **Students: you have a new college issued student email account** [click here to activate your new account.](#)
- 6th. Click where it says [click here.](#)
- 7th. You will then see your email address under the words college issued student email account. (for example (jdoe8@student.ccd.edu).
- 8th. Write it down and make sure to write three (3) c's not just two (2).
- 9th. Click where it says [click here](#) to access your account.
- 10th. Then you will see a page with Microsoft ExchangeLabs, Under it will say [Click here to access your account.](#) Click on it.
- 11th. Then click on the sign in button.
- 12th. Put your email address into the windows live id space.
- 13th. Since you are accessing your email for the first time your password is going to be your birth date. Spell out the month with the first letter in a capital letter (ABCD ect...). Then put in your day, don't forget a zero (0) if your day of birth is a single digit number (01, 02 ect...) and then your full year. For example if your birthday is August 4th 1987 your password will look like this, August041987. If your birthday is June 18th 1985 your password will look like this, June181985.
- 14th. You will then be prompted to create your own password. Enter it again where it says confirm your password.
- 15th. Then you set up your personal options.
- 16th. The time is (GMT- 07:00) Mountain Time (US & Canada).
- 17th. You have now activated your student email account.
- 18th. Write down your email address and password so you don't forget them and remember to check if often as you will be getting a lot of CCD important information messages there.

I am working toward a degree in child psychology. I want to start working as soon as I graduate, but most job advertisements require work experience.

Dear FastStart@CCD Student,

Thanks for your question. It is a perplexing dilemma, but there are a few ways that you can solve this problem. The first way is to volunteer for an organization where you can gain the work experience that you need. For example, you are working on a degree in child psychology. You could volunteer at the Children's Hospital, the Boys and Girls Club or for a non-profit counseling organization. Employers recognize volunteer hours as valuable work experience. Another way to get work experience is to get an internship.

An internship may be available through your college program or you can solicit employers by calling the human resource department and asking if there are internship opportunities at their company.
