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Reading Strategy SQR3: Survey-Question-Read-Recite-Review

Use the SQR3 reading strategy to give purpose to reading a text and to improve material recall.

Survey

- Preview the reading to get an idea of what the chapter or article is about
- Underline: titles, headings, captions, and words in bold/italic to build background knowledge

Question

- Create questions to provide focus toward reading the text
- Turn the underlined text features into questions to give purpose to the reading

Read

- Actively read the text by reading one section or paragraph at a time
- Identify and underline the main idea of each paragraph
- Write or highlight the answers to the questions created

Recite

- Rewrite a short summary about the information from the text to check for understanding
- Practice recalling what was comprehended in the section or paragraph of the text by rephrasing the information

Review

- Study over several sessions. For example, review for 10-minutes per day
- Re-read any notes, written summaries, or highlighted text
- Self-test by answering questions created from the reading
