The Academic Advising and Student Success Center

DSF; GEAR Up Scholars; First Year Experience (FYE)

DSF and GEAR Up scholarship recipients' as well as FYE participation in success programming with your Academic Advisor fulfills the program requirement for additional institutional scholarships you may be awarded.

Link

The Link program includes consultation with your Advisor to review a structured Success Guide that provides individualized support as you move along your academic journey. The Guide serves as a map to resources and services that best support credit completion. It is designed to promote self-advocacy, student engagement, semester to semester completion and graduation/transfer readiness.

UMI

The Urban Male Initiative (UMI) provides relevant experiences for male students at Community College of Denver to ensure academic success, professional growth and social maturity in the areas of education, leadership, career exposure, social awareness and community involvement. Students in UMI are expected to meet with their Academic Advisor on a regular basis and actively participate in the program.

WISE

Women Intentional about Success and Excellence (WISE) is designed to facilitate professional and leadership development for women attending CCD. WISE seeks to enhance the overall educational experience through one-on-one coaching, a series of workshops, panel discussions and guest speakers as well as opportunities to build community, network and participate in service learning/volunteer projects. Students

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in the WISE program are expected to actively participate in the program and meet with their Academic Advisor on a regular basis.

KEYS

Available only to KEYS scholars, this program is designed to assist displaced homemakers in becoming self-sufficient. A displaced homemaker is an individual who had been dependent on another household member's income and has lost that primary source of income.
