## Steps to Success

## 1. Start Each Semester off Right

Use this planner to set class times, study and work schedules, and appointments with instructions.

- Log into D2L at ccd.desire2learn.com; review the syllabus for each registered class and confirm important dates with your professors.
- Immediately add dates from the syllabus into your planner:
- Exam dates
- Project and homework due dates
- Study group meeting times
- Time to read, study and do homework
- Get your books and supplies before classes begin and review your books before the first day. Visit AurariaBooks. com or participate in the Lending Library at CCD.edu/Lending-Library.
- Obtain your student ID card and RTD pass by bringing a copy of your current schedule, a valid, government issued photo ID and \$22 to Tivoli Station.
- Use your student email address to stay in constant contact with the College. Check this email regularly.


## 2. Be a Model Student

- Advocate for yourself.
- Attend all classes.
- Sit at the front of the room or close to the instructor and participate in class discussions.
- Ask questions and listen to other students.
- Take notes.
- Review your notes after each class.
- Make an appointment to speak with your instructor during office hours to ask questions and get help; do so before you are struggling.
- Want an A instead of a B? Not sure if you will pass a class? Visit our computer \& tutoring services labs regularly for assistance.
- Know students in your classes. Form and attend study groups.
- If you need to make-up or retake an exam, contact your instructor and then schedule your exam at CCD.edu/Testing.
- Attend Student Success Workshops, CCD.edu/Student-Success.

Meet with your Academic Advisor at least
one month before registration opens.

- First-time new students - Advisors
will help navigate the transition into college, including investigating choices before selecting a certificate
or degree program, sharing college preparation course information, core program requirements and how to access college support services. Check your student email address for college correspondence.
- Continuing students - Advisors serve as your 'graduation coach' and offer continued support focused on the successful completion of your chosen academic program. Review your degree plan in DegreeWorks and with your Advisor. Log into CCDConnect and click on "DegreeWorks." Meet with your Advisor at least twice during the semester to discuss campus resources and your graduation plan.

## 7. Get Financial Aid

Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at FAFSA. gov every year to determine eligibility to receive financial aid money such as the Federal Pell Grant, Federal Direct Loans as well as CCD scholarships.

- Priority deadline for the FAFSA is April 15. CCD's School Code is 009542.
- Financial aid application processing takes two to four weeks for you to be awarded. Some funds run out quickly, so start early and follow up with the Financial Aid office.
- To retain financial aid eligibility, you must meet Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) requirements, which include maintaining an overall 2.0 GPA and not failing or withdrawing from too many classes.

## 8. Pay for Classes

Pay your tuition and fees in full by the payment deadline so that your classes are not dropped. For deadlines or to set up a payment plan, visit CCDConnect. If you are approved for financial aid, confirm that your award is enough to
cover the bill. Check with the cashier about Nelnet Business Solutions (payment option).

- If you register for a course after the payment deadline, payment is due at the time you register.
- If you miss the payment deadline, you may be dropped from classes and need to re-register. Your original classes may or may not be available.
- Access your Student Refund Account to select your refund preferences once you receive the information in the mail. Contact the Cashier's office with questions about your refund preferences: 303.352.2075 or businessoffice@ccd.edu

Students will understand and apply conventions of effective writing and oral communication in academic, public, and professional discourse.

Students will explore and evaluate multiple sources of information, which they will synthesize to solve problems; they will extract meaning from texts, instruction, experience, and other relevant sources to construct new problem-solving approaches based on their insights. Students will make relevant connections between classroom and out-of-classroom learning.

# CCD Institutional Outcomes 

## Community College of Denver has established the following institutional outcomes:

A CCD graduate is a Numeric Thinker. Students will select relevant data and use several methods such as algebraic, geometric, and statistical reasoning to solve problems; they will interpret and draw inferences from data and mathematical models; they are able to represent mathematical information symbolically, graphically, numerically, and verbally.

A CCD graduate is Personally Responsible. Students will incorporate ethical reasoning into action; they will explore and articulate the values of professionalism in personal decision-making. They exemplify dependability, honesty, trustworthiness, and accept personal accountability for their choices and actions. Students will exhibit self-reliant behaviors, including managing time effectively, accepting supervision and direction as needed, perseverance, valuing contributions of others, and holding themselves accountable for obligations.

Students will consider the interconnectedness of our community and world; they will understand how cultural differences (such as beliefs, traditions, religion, ethnicity, sexuality, and gender) impact personal and community participation; they are aware of the social, environmental, and economic impacts of their actions; they evaluate how technology links individuals and communities and are aware of the social, environmental, technological, and economic impacts of their actions.

A CCD graduate is an Effective Communicator. Students will convey meaning by writing and speaking coherently and effectively in a way that others understand; students will write and speak after reflection; students will influence others through writing, speaking, or artistic expression that is appropriate for the context and audience; students will use appropriate syntax and grammar; students will listen attentively to others and respond appropriately. Students will understand and apply conventions of effective writing and oral communication in academic, public, and professional discourse.

A CCD graduate is a Complex Thinker. Students will explore and evaluate multiple sources of information, which they will synthesize to solve problems; they will extract meaning from texts, instruction, experience, and other relevant sources to construct new problem-solving approaches based on their insights. Students will make relevant connections between classroom and out-of-classroom learning.

A CCD graduate is an Effective and Ethical User of Technology. Students will exhibit technological literacy and the skills to effectively use it; they will demonstrate the responsible application of intellectual property and privacy; students will use technology ethically and effectively to communicate, solve problems, and complete tasks; students will remain current with technological innovations.
