ACADEMIC ADVISING REQUIREMENT

Tracking your progress with your Academic Advisor is imperative in order to stay on track toward graduation. SUPPORT PROGRAM REQUIREMENT

PLEASE NOTE: Choose a program that best fits your needs. You will be required to actively participate in the program prior to your Academic Advisor signing your scholarship contract. Therefore, it is better to join the program of your choice as soon as you learn you have been offered a scholarship

TRIO Student Support Services (SSS) – Provides services that include academic guidance, tutoring and skills development, financial aid and financial planning assistance, transfer assistance, career development, peer mentoring, social and cultural activities, and referral to campus and community resources throughout a student's career at CCD. TRIO SSS students must meet the federal government eligibility requirements such as overcoming an educational obstacle such as limited income, first generation to attend college, or disability. Student success programs in the Academic Advising and Student Success Center

The Academic Advising and Student Success Center houses several student support programs, all designed to provide students with wrap-around student support services which include one-on-one intrusive academic advising, coaching, professional and leadership development and a variety of workshops focusing on student academic, financial and personal wellness. Programs like the Urban Male Initiative (UMI) and Women Intentional about Success and Excellence (WISE) are two student support programs offered through the Center. DSF; GEAR UP and COSI Scholars (DSF Students Only)

DSF and GEAR UP scholarship recipients are required to participate in this program and participation with this program will also fulfill the program requirement institutional scholarships awarded.

KEYS

Available only to KEYS scholars, this program is designed to assist displaced homemakers in becoming self-sufficient. A displaced homemaker is an individual who had been dependent on another household member's income and has lost that primary source of income. 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HSI-STEM SIRVIENDO

HSI-STEM Sirviendo Scholars receive personalized assistance to identify career goals and develop educational plans to reach them. WORKSHOP/EOC REQUIREMENT

Student Success Workshops

You have the option to attend a financial literacy workshop hosted by the Financial Aid Office every semester or complete a Project Success financial literacy module online. Below are the steps to complete a financial literacy module online.

- Go to the [Project Success webpage](https://www.projectsucceedfinlit.org/registration/index.cfm?accesscode=009542) <https://www.projectsucceedfinlit.org/registration/index.cfm?accesscode=009542>
- Create an account by filling out all the information requested on the initial landing page.
- You can click on 'Log In' in the top right corner if you've already created an account.
- Click on 'Courses' in the toolbar towards the top left of the page.
- Click on 'Show available courses' for a listing of all courses available and choose 1 to complete.
- Once a course is completed, record is kept on the 'Courses' page and a link to your certificate is provided.
- The certificate can be printed or saved as a PDF.
- A 'Correct' Score of at least 80% is needed and certificate must be provided.

TRIO - Educational Opportunity Center (EOC)

The TRIO-EOC offers many services to help you succeed, including career exploration counseling, student financial aid advising, FAFSA assistance, financial literacy information, and assistance with scholarship searches. Educational Access Specialists can help assist you in identifying or redefining career goals through the use of career interest inventories.
