


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Keyboarding Support

Learning the Home Keys

Home keys are where one places their fingers when learning to type. The home keys include F, D, S, and A on the left of the keyboard, and J, K, L, and; (semicolon) on the right of the keyboard. Poising the fingers over home keys is good technique for typing. It makes finding keys without looking easier and faster.
