- Obtain your Student ID card and RTD pass by bringing a copy of your current schedule, a valid, government issued photo ID and the ID cost of \$20 to Tivoli 269.

Apply for and Renew Financial Aid

Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at www.FAFSA.gov every year to determine eligibility to receive federal financial aid money such as Pell Grants and Federal Direct Stafford Loans and local CCD scholarships. Be sure to check the Work Study box on the FAFSA for campus work opportunities and continue to apply for institutional scholarships.

- Priority deadline for the FAFSA is April 15. CCD's Title IV School Code is 009542
- Financial aid application processing takes four to six weeks. Some funds run out quickly, so start early!
- To retain Financial Aid eligibility, students must meet Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) requirements which include maintaining a cumulative 2.0 GPA and not failing or withdrawing from too many classes.
- Questions? Speak with a Financial Aid Counselor in Confluence 120.
- Free online loan Entrance Counseling for first-time loan borrowers is required. The counseling will inform you about terms and conditions of receiving and repaying loans.

View your registration, financial aid status, and access your student email account, sign in to CCDConnect.

Renew your FAFSA for the upcoming academic year at www.FASFA.gov or stop by Financial Aid in Confluence.

Bay for Classes So You Don't Get Dropped

Pay your tuition and fees in full by the payment deadline. For deadlines see CCDConnect, Student Tab. If you are approved for

financial aid, confirm that your award is enough to cover the bill. Check with the cashier about FACTS (payment option).

- If you register for a course after the payment deadline, payment is due at the time you register.
- If you miss the payment deadline, you will be dropped from classes and need to re-register. Your original classes may or may not be available.
- Activate your HigherOne/CCCS Refund Card to select your refund preferences once you receive the card in the mail.

By gubernatorial decree and in compliance with applicable laws, the illegal use of alcohol, other drugs, or controlled substances when on campus is prohibited.

Auraria Campus Smoking Policy

For a complete version of the Smoking Policy please see www.ahec.edu/files/general/Policy-Smoking.pdf

The smoking of any substance is strictly prohibited:

1. In all buildings on the Auraria Campus, including those in the institutional neighborhoods and buildings owned by the constituent institutions therein. This prohibition shall not extend to facilities off of the Auraria Campus, such as, for example, CU Denver's Lawrence Street Center, MSU Denver's North or South Campuses, or CCD's Lowry Campus;

2. Within twenty-five (25) feet of any entrance,

passageway, operable window or ventilation system of any Auraria Campus building;

3. Within The Regency Athletic Complex at MSU Denver or in any other outdoor area on the Auraria Campus that is posted with signs prohibiting smoking in that area; and

4. In any vehicle owned or leased by the Auraria Board/Auraria Higher Education Center, including automobiles, trucks, vans, shuttles, and work/golf carts.

The smoking or other use or consumption of marijuana or marijuana concentrate is strictly prohibited in any indoor or outdoor area of the Auraria Campus.

Smoking, for the purposes of this policy, shall include the use of e-cigarettes, electronic vaping devices, personal vaporizers, electronic nicotine delivery systems, or other such devices which vaporize substances to simulate smoking. Exceptions may be made for the use of such devices for theatrical purposes during productions sponsored by the constituent institutions; provided that the substance being Administrative Policies and Procedures Office of the Executive Vice President for Administration AHEC Smoking Policy 2 vaporized does not contain nicotine or marijuana concentrate and that written approval for such use is obtained from the chief academic officer of the sponsoring institution and the Chief of the Auraria Campus Police Department.

Illegal Drugs

The policy for Auraria and the institutions prohibits the sale, manufacture, distribution, use or possession of illegal drugs on the Auraria Campus. This policy applies equally to administrators, faculty, staff, and students.

NOTE: Although possession and use of marijuana consistent with the requirements of the Colorado Constitution is no longer a crime in the State of Colorado, the possession and use of marijuana remains illegal under federal law. Consistent with federal law, including the Controlled Substances Act and the Drug Free Schools and Communities Act, the use and/ or possession of marijuana continues to be prohibited while a student is on college owned or college controlled property, and/or any function authorized or supervised by the college and/or in state owned or leased vehicles.

Potential Sanctions for Violations of the Alcohol & Drug Policy

At the Community College of Denver, any student who is found to be in violation of the alcohol and/or drug policy will be adjudicated under the Student Code of Conduct: www.CCD. edu/StudentCode.

A student found responsible for a violation may face sanctions, which range from a warning to expulsion.

CCD Institutional Outcomes

Community College of Denver has established the following institutional outcomes:

A CCD graduate is an **Effective Communicator**. Students will convey meaning by writing and speaking coherently and effectively in a way that others understand; students will write and speak after reflection; students will influence others through writing, speaking, or artistic expression that is appropriate for the context and audience; students will use appropriate syntax and grammar; students will listen attentively to others and respond appropriately. Students will understand and apply conventions of effective writing and oral communication in academic, public, and professional discourse.

A CCD graduate is a **Complex Thinker**. Students will explore and evaluate multiple sources of information, which they will synthesize to solve problems; they will extract meaning from texts, instruction, experience, and other relevant sources to construct new problem-solving approaches based on their insights. Students will make relevant connections between classroom and out-of-classroom learning.

A CCD graduate is an **Effective and Ethical User of Technology**. Students will exhibit technological literacy and the skills to effectively use it; they will demonstrate the responsible application of intellectual property and privacy; students will use technology ethically and effectively to communicate, solve problems, and complete tasks; students will remain current with technological innovations.
