

MLA Citation for Digital Storytelling

Perform an internet search for “[Electronic sources MLA](#)” for specific formatting guidelines for pictures, sounds, and videos. As you find and create pictures, music and videos, copy and paste the source information into a document.

Once your citations are polished, you have two options for putting citations at the end of your video:

1. Copy your citations and paste into a text box at the end of your video. Adjust the text size, color, font, and position to make it easy to read. If you have too many citations for one screen, make as many text boxes as you need and adjust the duration of each clip to your liking.
2. Use the Snipping Tool or screenshot your Works Cited page. Upload this JPEG to the end of your video. Ensure it is legible and not too small or overly pixelated.
