Program Additions

Bioengineering- University of Colorado Denver Transfer

The Associate of Science (AS) in Bioengineering transfer program at Community College of Denver (CCD) is designed for students seeking a seamless pathway to a Bachelor of Science (BS) in Bioengineering at the University of Colorado Denver (CU Denver). This program provides the foundational coursework in mathematics, chemistry, biology, engineering, and physics necessary for success in upper-division bioengineering studies.

Students complete the first two years of general education and core science requirements at CCD, benefiting from small class sizes, supportive faculty, and affordable tuition. The curriculum is carefully aligned with CU Denver's Bioengineering program to ensure transferability and degree progress.
